

DACA RENEWAL GUIDE

Submit your DACA renewal application 120 to 150 days before your DACA expires. In most cases, you *do not* need to submit evidence (such as school records) like you did for your first DACA application. You *do* need to submit evidence if: you have had trouble with the police since you got DACA, you have a case in immigration court, you left the country without advance parole since you got DACA, or you were granted DACA before August 15, 2012 by ICE. If any of those situations apply to you, contact an immigration attorney.

Checklist

- Forms I-821D, I-765, and I-765 Worksheet (available at <http://www.uscis.gov/i-821d>)
- Two passport-style photos with your name and A-number written on the back
- Copy of your work permit, front and back
- Check or money order for \$495 made out to “U.S. Department of Homeland Security”

Form-Filling Tips

- It's helpful to have a copy of your last DACA application for reference.
- Your A-number is the 9-digit “USCIS #” on your work permit. It's also printed on all notices from USCIS.
- I-821D Part 2: Only list addresses and travel since your last DACA application.
- I-821D Part 3: All of Part 3 is for initial requests only, so you can leave it blank.
- I-765 Question 11: For “Which USCIS Office,” write the first three letters of the “Card #” on your work permit. It might be “WAC” or “LIN.” For “Dates,” write the date that you applied, or if you don't remember, write the date that your work permit became valid.
- I-765 Question 15: Write “DACA.”
- I-765 Question 16: Write “(c)(33).”
